
UNDERMOUNT

Undermount sinks sit below the depth of the counter, and are secured in place on its underside. They offer a streamlined look and facilitate an easy to maintain countertop. Undermounting also adds some depth to your overall sink capacity.



VESSEL

Vessel sinks come in a wide range of unique shapes and statement looks. Typically resembling a bowl or basin, they sit on top of the counter and often pair well with waterfall or vintage faucets. These are great decorative options for powder rooms and ensuite vanities.



FARMHOUSE

Farmhouse or "apron" sinks offer increased capacity and a modern take on nostalgic charm. They are typically undermount sinks and always have an exposed front that extends past the edge of the cabinetry. They can come with a single or double basin.



ULTRA-WIDE WORKSTATION

Some sinks are designed with ultimate capacity in mind – whether to fit awkwardly shaped dishes for scrubbing or wash the whole family's hands at bedtime. If you're willing to search a little harder and pay a little more, you can find a sink in just about any depth, width, and shape you can think of.



DROP-IN

Drop-in sinks are lowered into place from above, and their edges are sealed against the countertop. This is the most traditional sink style, so available in a wide range of colours and finishes, and is also the easiest sink to replace (without damaging the counter).
